Think of some of the insects from the story, can you list some words that rhyme with their names?

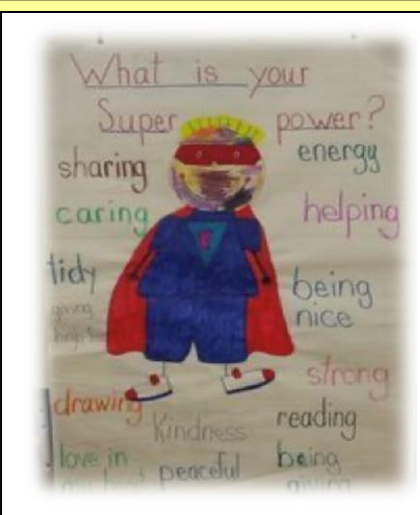
E.g slug – hug
