

WALT: Solve a word problem


There are **15 beads** in a string of beads. **8** of the beads are **black** the rest are white.

How many white beads are there in the string of beads?




Draw to solve.




Put water in a clear cup or glass to show these measurements.

Change the story of 'Monkey see Monkey do'.


Think of another person and what they could be selling.
